

DENMARK'S INTERNATIONAL STUDY PROGRAM APPLICATION

We are pleased that you are applying for this Overseas Academic Program coordinated through the University of Pittsburgh. The University of Pittsburgh Study Abroad Office will provide you with the necessary information on Denmark's International Study Program. The attached application forms are to be completed. There are four parts to the application:

1. The three-page application form consists of biographic data, academic background and miscellaneous information.
2. The "Applicant's Program of Study Statement" is to be carefully written and then reviewed with and signed by your department chairman or academic advisor.
3. Two copies of the "Confidential Reference Form" upon which you are to fill in your name, the name of your reference, and the type of reference at the top of the form. One form should then be given to a professor who knows you well and who can judge your academic qualifications for study abroad. The second should be given to a person who is particularly acquainted with your non-academic attributes, interests, and activities, and who is not another student or a member of your family.
4. **IMPORTANT**: An official copy of your academic transcript(s) for all university-level work is required as part of your application.

Be sure that your entire application, including transcripts and confidential references (in sealed envelopes), reaches the Study Abroad Office of the University of Pittsburgh as early as possible, but at least by the deadline date set for the particular program. All applicants will be notified as quickly as possible concerning the action taken on their respective applications. Those accepted in the program will receive information concerning travel arrangements, orientations, payment schedules, passports and visas, health insurance, and other essential details.
